



## STUDY ASSESSEMENT

The curriculum for each course of study specifies the type of assessment the student will have to comply with in order to pass that particular course and obtain the number of credits allocated to the subject.

The assessment can be done either by means of an examination or other types of assessment procedures (colloquia, mid-term examinations, project papers, etc.), some of which may be graded “passed” or “failed”.

However, as a general rule, in Romania marks are given on a scale of 1 to 10, with 5 meaning that “performance meets the minimum criteria required in order to pass”, 10 meaning “outstanding performance” and 1 to 4 meaning “failed”.

During an academic year, for each subject of study you may take the examination twice.

Failure to pass a subject that was included in your learning agreement means that you have to re-register for that subject and pay a fee according to the number of credits allocated to that course.

That is why you have to ensure that you fully understand what is expected of you. There are precise requirements for each subject, and a breach of these rules may lead to penalties.
