



RULES AND REGULATIONS DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

General rules and regulations that apply in Romania according to the CNSU decision of 09.11.2021 – reinstating the measures set in CNSU decision of 25.10.2021:

1. circulation outside your place of residence from 22.00 to 05.00 is prohibited. Exceptions:
 - a. people who have had a complete vaccination scheme and 10 days have passed since the completion of said vaccination scheme
 - b. people who have had Covid-19 in the last 180 days (but are not in the first 14 days since a positive test)
 - c. people who are travelling for work reasons (declaration to be filled in and presented)
 - d. people who need medical assistance that cannot be postponed (declaration to be filled in and presented)
 - e. people who are in transit (and can prove that by presenting tickets, boarding cards, etc.)
 - f. people who have justified reasons (such as taking care of children, the elderly, the disabled or who are travelling because of a death in the family) - (declaration to be filled in and presented)
 - g. in order to prove your vaccination status or that you have had Covid-19 in the past 180 days, you need the EU green pass or medical documents in English or Romanian pertaining to the above mentioned situations if you are from a country that does not issue the EU green pass
2. all economic agents (shops, restaurants, etc.) as well as museums, cinemas, libraries, gyms, etc. will close down at 21.00. After 21.00, economic agents can provide home deliveries. Exceptions:
 - a. pharmacies and gas stations, as well as transport companies
3. Restaurants and cafes can only operate at 50% capacity
4. Gyms, cinemas, theatres, etc. can only operate at 30% capacity
5. Bars, clubs and discos will close down
6. All private events (weddings, parties, workshops, conferences, etc.) are forbidden
7. Sport events will be organized without spectators in attendance
8. Protests and demonstrations can only take place with a maximum of 100 people who are either vaccinated or have had covid-19 in the past 180 days, respecting social distancing rules and wearing a mask at all times
9. Churches can organize sermons indoors and outdoors respecting social distancing rules and wearing a mask at all times



10. Outdoors sport activities can be organized for a maximum of 10 people who do not live in the same household and who are either vaccinated or have had Covid-19 in the past 180 days
11. Access to all events, activities and economic agents (restaurants, cafes, hotels, cinemas, theatres, etc.) is limited to people who have had a complete vaccination scheme and 2 days have passed since the completion of said vaccination scheme and people who have had Covid-19 in the last 180 days (but are not in the first 14 days since a positive test)
12. Access to all public institutions is limited only to people who have a valid EU green pass or people who can present proof they have had Covid-19 in the past 180 days, have had a complete vaccination scheme or have had the proper tests done in the past 48 hours (antigen test) or 72 hours (RT-PCR test)
13. Masks are mandatory in all public spaces (indoors or outdoors), at all workplaces and in all means of public transportation
14. IMPORTANT: Updates will be available at <https://stirioficiala.ro/hotarari> (Romanian only). Should further restrictions be adopted and/or lifted, students will be informed by email by the responsible person.

Rules and regulations at Universitatea Babeș-Bolyai during the Covid-19 Pandemic:

1. Academic activity is organized by each faculty according to the rules set up by the Ministry of Education (if the case), the University (decision 10753/14.09.2021) and faculty resources. Each faculty will post this information on their website in a timely manner. Students are expected to check the websites regularly for additional information for their respective faculty.
2. All Erasmus+ students are informed by email before the start of the semester about the latest decision of the faculty regarding organization of courses. Once students begin their mobilities, students will need to check the faculty websites and/or special Covid-19 University page for updates.
3. Rules and Regulations in UBB Dormitories during the Covid-19 Pandemic

1. Dormitory places are available only for students who comply one of the following conditions (approved in Resolution 10753/14.09.2021 – available at [SKM C300i21091416120 \(ubbcluj.ro\)](#)):
 - a. have been vaccinated against the SARS-CoV-2 virus and 10 days have passed after the completion of the entire immunisation programme;
 - b. are between the 15th and 180th day after being confirmed with SARS-CoV-2 infection.
 - c. Students who are unable to be vaccinated owing to documented health issues may be accommodated in a special regime if they request it.
 - d. International students from non-EU countries who do not have access to vaccinations and cannot be vaccinated until after obtaining a residence permit in Romania may be accommodated in a special regime upon request, subject to availability, provided that they are vaccinated as soon as possible after obtaining resident status.
2. Proof of complying with one of the following conditions should be presented by students by email to the responsible person at the Centre for International cooperation before accommodation check-in and to the dormitory accommodation committee upon check-in (according to internal procedures set by the University).
3. Rules and regulations applying to students accommodated in the UBB dormitories:
 - a. Rigorous hand hygiene
 - b. Both tenants and hire staff must be wearing the protection mask during their stay in student dorms' common areas
 - c. Contact among students, and between students and staff will be allowed either online, wearing a mask and maintaining a 1m distance from one another
 - d. Avoiding the exchange of accommodation rooms between students
 - e. Permanent maintenance of 1m distance in student dorms' common areas



- f. 2 Access of any foreign person in student dorms is strictly forbidden, with exceptional cases (with the approval of the head of the Social Service and/or of the dorm administrator)
 - g. Access into the dorm will be permitted through one entry, based on student ID card (updated). Access of students, staff, doctoral students or any other who can justify their presence on campus will be done after epidemiologic triage according to the triage protocol and after hand disinfection upon entry into student dorms
 - h. Movement within the student dorms will be limited and gatherings avoided
 - i. People's access and traffic will be managed upon entry into student dorms, by doormen, so that the physical distance of 1,5 m among people be complied with
 - j. The staff working within the dorms must observe and report students' health conditions, and they must report people who present respiratory symptoms
 - k. All students and hired staff must disinfect their hands upon entering the dorm and any time this is required
 - l. All students and hired staff must wear the protection mask appropriately while in common areas of the dorms and during their activity within the student dorms
 - m. Contact with frequently touched surfaces (doors, doorknobs, light switches, lift buttons etc.) must be avoided and everyone must disinfect their hands after touching such surfaces
 - n. It is forbidden to exchange personal objects or use them jointly with other people
 - o. It is forbidden to consume foods and beverages jointly with other people
 - p. Bedrooms will be ventilated by their tenants for at least 30 minutes in the morning and as frequently as possible during the day
 - q. Students will be informed on the provisions and obligations to comply with the isolation protocol
 - r. Common areas will be avoided as much as possible, and study activities will take place in each student's bedroom (no warm food is to be cooked in bedrooms)
 - s. Students must maintain cleanliness, disinfect and ventilate their rooms regularly
 - t. Students accommodated in dorms must inform the dorm administrator of their absence from the student dorm during the night
4. Isolation procedures:
- a. In case of suspicion or confirmation of SARS-CoV-2 infection, the isolation protocol approved by the university will be in force
 - b. Immediate isolation of the student presenting SARS-COV-2 symptoms and of their roommates will be in compliance with the individual protection measures
 - c. The quarantined/isolated student from the dorm will not be taken to the general physician and/or the emergency room or hospital unless their symptoms are severe; in that case, they will call 112 emergency number; the person helping the isolated student must avoid entering into contact with the latter, must wear a mask and thoroughly wash their hands for at least 20 seconds before and after interacting with said student
 - d. A special disinfectant will be used to hygienise the room, after the student is gone, in order to reduce the risk of infecting others.



Rules and regulations if Erasmus student is tested positive for Covid-19

1. Students who test positive at a medical laboratory or hospital or approved pharmacy:
 - a. need to self-isolate immediately alongside their room mate(s)
 - b. need to inform the Erasmus+ officer in charge of Erasmus+ incoming students by email about the result and request assistance if they need any. Students can choose to provide their mobile phone numbers and/or Facebook profiles for easier communication with the Erasmus+ officer in charge of Erasmus+ incoming students
 - c. need to get in touch with the UBB medical office for medical advice or call 112 if they symptoms are severe
 - d. need to answer all questions of the Cluj Department for Public Health in relation to the epidemiological inquiry performed by the Cluj Department for Public Health. Students can contact the Cluj Department for Public Health at the following numbers: 0214144464 (Monday to Friday from 08.00 to 16.00) and 0264433645 (outside the timetable stated above).  - e. students who are accommodated in UBB dormitories will need to move to the special isolation dormitory Juventus for the entire self-isolation of 14 days and they need to inform the administrator of the positive result by email.
 - i. The students cannot leave the isolation room unless for medical emergencies or in case of a dormitory emergency (fire, earthquake, etc.)
 - ii. Students will need to bring their own clothing and pans/pots/cutlery/plates.
 - iii. Students will receive bed linen at the isolation dormitory.
 - iv. Students will be able to order groceries/food/any other permitted products – the drop in point is the Universitas reception – the receptionist will bring the order to the front of the door for the student.
 - v. Students will deposit their dirty bed linen and garbage on the isolation room balcony. The dormitory cleaning services will collect them at the end of the isolation for the student.
 - vi. Students can return to their original dormitory place after the self-isolation period on the basis of either the Cluj Department for Public Health Self-Isolation Decision or a certificate issued by the UBB medical office.
 - f. Students who live in private accommodation need to comply with the self-isolation instructions provided by the Cluj Department for Public Health and do their isolation in their private accommodation. Students who have room mate(s) need to contact the Cluj Department for Public Health for instructions on quarantine conditions for them.
2. Students who test positive at a home test need to inform the Erasmus+ officer in charge of Erasmus+ incoming students by email about the result and request assistance if they need any. Students will be advised to take a test at a medical laboratory / hospital / approved pharmacy. Students should isolate immediately alongside their room mate(s) until further instructions.
